

Report of Foreign Property Must be Filed by August 31

Under new regulations issued by the United States Treasury department on June 1, all persons who had any interest, direct or indirect, in foreign property on May 31, 1943, must file a report relating to such property on or before Aug. 31 of this year, according to Irvin Lechliter, project attorney, who will be in his office in the Sentinel building to aid residents at any time.

The report will concern all residents who have tangible property in a foreign country or who have money, securities and other negotiable instruments for the payment of money issued or created by the United States and are now located in a foreign country.

Residents with Household Goods Stored in L.A. Tenrikyo Church to Fill Forms

Residents who have household goods and personal effects stored in the Tenrikyo Church at First and Saratoga Streets in Los Angeles, have been requested by James H. Porter, evacuee property officer, to call at his office in the Sentinel building as soon as possible to fill out WRA Forms 156 and 155. In a letter released from the Poston relocation center at the request of Kenneth Yoshioka, executive secretary of the Tenrikyo Church, R. W. Schmitt, Poston evacuee property officer says that evacuees have been advised by the WRA Commercial Property Supervisor in Los Angeles to remove their belongings to the WRA warehouse for safe keeping due to the fact that there have been two incidents of the church being broken in to. George William Dickinson, 112 West Ninth Street, Los Angeles, is the custodian of the church.

Hold Registration for Daily Vacation Church School
