Evacuee aliens who failed to report for the alien registration in 1941 or who have lost their certificates will have an opportunity to apply for either a new or duplicate certificate of identification, according to Joe Carroll, chief of employment. An inspector from the U.S. Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization service, will be at Hoart Mountain July 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 to register applicants. Identification photographs will be taken by the project photographer, according to Vaughn Mochau, reports officer.
