Camp Savage Recruiters Arrive Thursday

Colonel Kai Rasmussen and Technical Sergeant Arthur Kaneko of Camp Savage are scheduled to arrive here Thursday morning to enlist nisei volunteers for the Camp Savage Japanese language school, according to Joe Carroll, chief employment officer. Interviews for potential students will be held at Carroll's office.

Colonel Rasmussen believes that this latest step by the army is evidence of the ever-mounting recognition and trust which the nisei soldiers in every branch of the army have won for themselves and for all nisei who they represent.

"The nisei in the khaki and g.d.s., though woefully few in number, have valiantly and effectively held the advanced positions in the nisei's fight for recognition and acceptance as rightful members of the America citizenry," he said. Colonel Rasmussen added:

"It is time they were given reinforcements. Many loyal and farsighted nisei have already volunteered for service in the army but this is still only a dribble when compared to the river of men which the nisei can send forth from their ranks when they are awakened to the necessity. This is already apparent to the enlightened nisei of Hawaii who have by their whole-hearted loyalty and love for America won for themselves deserved recognition and honor, in whose reflected glory the nisei of America have basked. The nisei of America are beginning to realize this more every day; this is shown by the increasing number of them volunteering for the army."

"Of the various doors thrown open to the nisei by the War Department, the Savage School offers them the greatest chance for personal improvement and the opportunity for the nisei to make their greatest direct contribution to National defense. Their special talent for the Japanese language is now a critical war material, a powerful weapon, more vital than any amount of guns, tanks or ships."

Army Seeks Many Items Stored in Coast States

Sentinel to Carry WRA Segregation Story

Pre-announcement information concerning the WRA segregation program has been carried by Hearst newspapers, particularly in California, it was learned here today. It was pointed out, however, by administrative officials that not all of the factors regarding segregation are reliable since the Hearst press published premature information without authority of the director.

All the available and reliable information so far developed in Washington will be released to evacuees as soon as it is available, Project Director Guy Robertson announced. Saturday's Sentinel will announce the plans so far formulated although complete details are not yet available.
