Reunion of Families With Internees Delayed

Residents who have filed application for transfer to the family internment camp at Crystal City, Texas, are advised by the welfare department that no additional reunions of families can be effected earlier than October.

This information, from the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization, was received some time ago but applicants still are asking for transfer.

Further inquiry should not be made, either at Washington or of the welfare department here, since this step has been necessitated by conditions beyond the control of these offices. Applicants will be informed of any new developments.

Issue Call for 25 Sawmill Workers

An urgent call for 20 to 25 workers to operate the project sawmill was issued today by William B. Macfarlane, internal employment officer. The sawmill located in the mountains 30 miles west of the center is essential to the subsistence of Heart Mountain, Macfarlane said. Construction of root cellars, vital to the food program, is being delayed because of the lack of lumber. Those interested should contact Macfarlane immediately.

Cash Register Receipts Now Being Accepted

Cash register receipts up to July 15 will be accepted and exchanged for permanent receipts at the cashier's office in the administration building or at the stores in blocks 8 and 20 beginning today. Residents are asked to bring the receipts issued them at the time of the first rebate so that numbers may be recorded systematically.

Issei women between 25 and 50 years were urged by Anna Van Kirk, chief nurse, to register for the two-week nurses' aide course which begins next week at the hospital. Registration is being held at the office of chief nurse. Classes which will be conducted in Japanese, will be held three times a week. As students who have been assisting as nurses' aides will be returning to school in September, older women will be sorely needed, Miss Van Kirk said. Nisei classes began Thursday, but registration will be open until July 19.
