

Filing of Property Report Extended to November

Residents with property in foreign countries will have up to Nov. 1, 1943, to file their reports instead of Aug. 31, 1943, as announced recently, Irvin Lochlitor, project attorney, disclosed.

Persons with foreign property who have no legal residence or principal place of business in this country, must file their reports with either the Federal Reserve Bank of New York or San Francisco.

Lochlitor will be in his office in the Sentinel building to aid in the filing of reports.

Well-Baby Clinic at Hospital Discontinued

The well baby clinic at the hospital has been discontinued, according to Dolores Koese, public health nurse. Beginning Monday, infants up to two years of age will be examined once monthly at specified places. Examinations will be conducted by Dr. P.K. Ito, Mrs. Koese and two assistants. Babies needing further check-ups will be given appointments with a physician at the regular afternoon clinic. The new stop is being taken because exposure of well babies to ill patients in the out clinic was deemed unwise, Mrs. Koese said. Schedule for the blocks is as follows:
