

Install Six Phones to Handle Emergency Calls

Six new telephones have been installed to handle emergency calls, Shig Masunaga, chairman of the block managers group, announced. These are not to be confused with phones connected with the fire department. The six new phones are located at the southeast corner of block 5, south end of block 17, community activities building in block 16, police station in block 21, south end of block 24 and the southeast corner of block 28.

Red Cross Membership Drive Starts Monday

A membership drive will be launched on August 2 to raise funds for an independent branch of the Red Cross in Heart Mountain, according to Virgil Payne, administrative adviser of the organization. In conjunction with the campaign will be a raffle of 15 pieces of furniture made by the carpenters shop. The well-made articles will be on display during the drive. A definite place for the exhibit has not been selected as yet. Membership fee will be one dollar and a raffle ticket will be given for 25 cent contribution. The drawings will take place on the last day of the drive, Saturday, August 7. The locale of the drawings will be announced later. Contributions less than a dollar will also be accepted.

Each block will conduct its own drive according to plans announced by the block committee which consists of a block manager, block chairman and two representatives. Fifty per cent of the total proceeds will be contributed to the National Red Cross, and the remaining 50 per cent will be the working fund of the local unit. A Red Cross here will provide the residents with many advantages. Anson Fujioka has been conducting work in the home service department since the first of the year. He has also been aiding the residents in sending and receiving messages to and from relatives in Japan besides giving assistance to servicemen whenever necessary.

Classes in first aid will be provided and will be open to all who are interested. Plans have been proposed to form various home nursing groups which will give assistance to any resident requesting aid. "I hope the residents of Heart Mountain will realize the importance of the National Red Cross in this community and respond wholeheartedly to this call for contributions," Miss Payne said.
