

Dillon S. Myer to Speak Tonight

Dillon S. Myer, national director of the War Relocation Authority who arrived yesterday for a four-day visit, will address center residents at a mass meeting 7:30 p.m. today in the high school auditorium. A loudspeaker will be set up outside the auditorium for the expected overflow crowd.

The Boy Scout drum and bugle corps and Girl Scout pom-pom drill team will give exhibitions before Mr. Myer speaks.

The national director's subject is unannounced, but is expected to touch on future WRA plans and the position of evacuees. As this is the first time Mr. Myer is addressing all residents of the center, a large turnout is expected.
