

Well-Baby Clinic Hours Announced

Well-baby clinic hours were announced by Dolores Gorrell, public health nurse, for the benefit of the newly-arrived Tuleans. Although attendance is not compulsory, the clinic is the only means by which the health of the infant can be checked, Mrs. Gorrell said. When necessary appointments with physicians are given at this time. Advice on feeding, training and habit formation is also available. Pictures will be taken of each well baby clinic this month.

The schedule for the clinic, which is open 10 a.m.-12 M., follows:

First Monday of each month, blocks 23, 24, 25, 28, 29 and 30 at 24-26-S.

Second Monday of each month, blocks 20, 27, 12 and 17 at 12-26-S.

Fourth Monday of each month, blocks 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and 9 at 1-26-N.

Fourth Wednesday of each month, blocks 14, 15, 21 and 22 at 22-26-N.
