

### Illegally Obtained Government Property Must Be Returned

Government property illegally obtained by residents must be removed by Monday to a designated spot in each block for pick-up by truck, Marc L. Campbell, chief of the internal security, announced.

Possession of property including lumber, screens, stove pipes and other articles without proper authority is illegal under administrative instructions of the WRA and under the criminal code passed by the community council.

Douglas M. Todd, assistant project director, explained that the administration hoped to accomplish three purposes by this order: first, to stop people from taking lumber allocated to a particular job, retarding its completion since additional lumber cannot be obtained; second, to eliminate fire hazards created by storing objects in attics and under floors; third, to distribute lumber equally to those people who are urgently in need of it and who have no way of obtaining the material for their needs.

Violators of this order are subject to prosecution and a jail sentence not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding \$300.

### Training-Retraining Program Available to Residents

Residents interested in the training-retraining program of the adult education department should file applications with Walter Schösser, adult education director, in his office in the high school. The Washington vocational retraining committee has authorized a \$12 per month pay rate for trainees.

Apprenticeship training is offered for such project activities as agriculture, bakery, cabinet-making, carpentry and repair, electrical training, hair dressing, motor pool, nurse training, plumbing and sheet metal, secretarial work, shoe repair, teacher training and dress design.

Those over 21 who are unemployed but are capable of working will not be given clothing allowances.

### Crews to Pick Up Empty Barrels Beginning Tomorrow

Starting tomorrow, crews of men with trucks will begin a canvass of all barracks and mess halls to pick up wooden barrels for the pickling plant, James Ito, assistant agriculture superintendent announced. These barrels are needed to make takuwan.

New or used barrels cannot be purchased on the outside because of a shortage and 300 barrels are needed immediately if the residents wish to have takuwan, Ito said.

The first stage in the pickling of daikon has been completed at the plant with ten vats filled with daikon salted and weighted down with huge rocks. Each vat contains 125 crates or approximately 8,125 pounds of daikon.
