

Community Enterprises Declare Refund Payment

Refunds amounting to one-third of all outstanding certificates of indebtedness will be paid by checks, the date and method of distribution to be announced later, Ted Okumoto, chief accountant, disclosed. A payment of \$21, 942.56 will be made through checks which will be handled by the community enterprises stores and services without the usual charge. Certificates of less than \$1.00 will be paid in the entire amount.

All patrons of the community enterprises are reminded again by Okumoto that the transfers of certificates of indebtedness (blue note) are not complete until the certificates are properly signed by the original owner and brought to the main office of the enterprises for issuance of a new certificates to the transferees. Unless properly transferred, the payment on certificate will be made to the original owners.

Must Register for Leave Clearance and Selective Service

Boys and girls reaching the age of 17 years must register for leave clearance as other residents of the center did last year. Each should register immediately after his 17th birthday. Failure to comply will result in the individual's clearance being held up until such a registration is made and may keep them in camp for as long as two months. Youths reaching the age of 18 should also register for selective service. Both registration can be made at the leave clearance office.
