Tea, Miso Distributed to Local Residents

Distribution of green tea and miso from the Japanese Red Cross to the residents of the center will be completed this week-end, according to Linejiro Hayashida of the community council food committee.

All blocks with the exception of 7 and 25, will receive 268 packages of tea and 70,56 pounds of miso. Block 7 will be given 89 packages of tea and 23 pounds of miso and block 25, 201 packages of tea and 53 pounds of miso. Six packages of tea were donated to the hospital. The distribution to each apartment was left to the discretion of each block.

Plans for the distribution of the drugs also received from the Japanese Red Cross are still pending, according to Shogo Iwamoto, secretary of the community council.

Rumor Evacuees Killed in Denver Denied

DENVER--A persistent rumor that is gaining in proportions to the effect that as many as seven former evacuees were killed and from 150 to 200 injured in a riot here following the announcement of the Japanese atrocities in the Philippines, was denounced by Field Assistant Director Malcolm Pitts. Pitts declared that there was no riot or any other difficulty in Denver following the announcement.
