

Residents to Clean-up Barracks and Blocks Wednesday and Thursday

To compete for the special dinner which will be awarded to residents of the block accomplishing the most during the second annual clean-up week campaign which began Sunday, barracks and blocks throughout the project were expected to receive a thorough cleaning Wednesday and Thursday, according to the clean-up committee.

The schedule for the campaign reveals that on Wednesday residents of the 10 upper blocks, 30, 29, 28, 27, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, and 20, will clean both inside and outside their barracks and block proper. Fire department inspectors will inspect and offer suggestions. Sixteen trucks from the motor pool will haul trash and other debris to the dump pile.

On Thursday the 10 lower blocks, 17, 15, 14, 12, 9, 8, 7, 6, 2 and 1 will undergo the same program.

Effective Wednesday the fire department siren will blow at 11:45 a.m. and at 4:45 p.m. to signal quitting time for evacuee personnel. At the same time, it was announced, transportation will be supplied only during the noon hour from the administration building to the area. During stormy or extremely cold weather transportation will be furnished in the mornings and evenings as well, except for workers in the motor pool-warehouse area and in the fields.

Jobs are available for both men and women, issei or nisei, who are eligible for leave clearance. As a special inducement for girls to work as maids, the hotel will furnish board and room for \$1.00 per day, according to Mrs. Murayama. A whole section of guest rooms, with twin beds, steam heat and private baths has been converted into a dormitory for the girls use. A resident housemother looks after the welfare of the girls, following regulations similar to those of the YWCA dormitory, she said.

In describing the Stevens Hotel, Mrs. Murayama declared that it is the largest hotel in the world, having 3,000 rooms, and is centrally located in the city of Chicago. The hotel will be the headquarters for the coming Democratic convention.
