

Housing Space Will Not be Held for Residents on Seasonal Leave

To provide housing space for the new residents who are scheduled to come to Heart Mountain when the Jerome, Arkansas, center is closed, it will not be possible to hold quarters that are vacated when residents of this center go out on seasonal leave, Guy Robertson, project director, announced.

Upon return to the center from seasonal leave, quarters will again be provided as near the old location as can possibly be arranged. In the meantime, personal property left at the center should be packed and stored in the warehouse. All such property should be carefully marked with the owners name and family number.
