

Four Draftees Report to Ft. Logan for Pre-induction Examinations

Four residents, Ray Yoshihiro Fujinaga, Ken Kimura, Akira Inouye, and Takeshi Uyeda, became the first group of draftees to be ordered to report for their pre-induction physical examinations at Ft. Logan, Colo., when they left here last Friday, April 14; it was announced by selective service officials.

No date has been set when the next contingent will be called for their examinations. Previous to this month, residents received their "physicals" at Ft. Warren, Cheyenne.

Tax Payers Must File Statements

Tax payers must file a statement with the assessor of the county in which they own real or personal property in order to have the property assessed in their name and tax bills mailed to them when due, it was announced by Harvey Burnett, evaduce property officer. The statement must be filed between the first Monday in March and the last Monday in June.

If the statement is not filed the assessor enters the property upon the tax books showing record owner as not known and address unavailable; therefore, the owner will not receive his tax bill.

All secured personal property tax and one-half of the realty tax become due on Nov. 1 each year. Both installments may be paid when the first payment is made if desired. Eight per cent penalty will be added to the first installment if the tax is unpaid by 5 p.m., December 5, and three per cent additional will be added if unpaid by April 20 of each year. Three per cent penalty and fifty cent for cost of advertising will be added to each item of tax remaining unpaid on April 20.

These penalties are effective until sales to the state (on or about June 30), after which redemption penalties become effective.
