

Rockford Relocation Office Transferred to Chicago

The Rockford relocation office was transferred to Chicago, Ill. on May 15, merging into the Greater Illinois district office located at 226 W. Jackson boulevard, it was announced by the relocation office.

The Greater Illinois district will now assume all relocation functions for the entire state of Illinois, except the Chicago metropolitan district.

Reasons given for the merger were that resettlement in Rockford has been more successful in proportion to population than has been true in any city in the north central area, and the number of resettlers in the city will continue to increase normally through the efforts of persons already resettled there.

Seasonal Cannery Job Offer for 200 Women Received Here

A seasonal cannery job offer from June 12 to July 31 for 200 women, 18 years of age and over, in Athena, Ore., has been submitted to the outside employment office.

The work will be processing peas, and the contract calls for 6 days a week at 63¢ an hour for the first 10 hours per day, and time and half overtime. Will work 11½ hours a day or an average of \$7.70 per day. If the women work 7 consecutive days in a week, double time for the seventh day will be paid.

Housing will be furnished either in a WPA camp or by the cannery. No specific information as to subsistence charges has been received, but it will probably be at regular WPA rate of \$1.20 per day, the employment office said.

All women residents who registered for seasonal work and who are interested in this offer should contact the outside employment office. Registration will begin 8 a.m. Friday.

篤志米人シユミット博士夫妻

現状打開策を説く

再轉住した二世達に依つて増はれた對日系人好感は、遂にシユミット博士夫妻も自費で費府(米國三大都市の二)より當館府に未だリ「戰時避難民」である日系人を以前の生活状態に復歸せしめんと、基本的に日系人を研究、一週向當地に滞在し、去る月曜、早朝、希望を花いて快然と帰途に就かされた。

シ博士は所内の産兒家庭に嬰兒用々具一切を送附して、これらのお馴染みみの米國友愛協會々員で、両親は獨逸系帰化市民、博士自身が常に獨逸二世だ……と口にしたのに徴しても、その真意と誠意の程が推知し得る。

博士の談

少數の米人が排日的態度を執つたからと言つて幾々の

白哲人に悪感情を抱くのは自己を缺めるものではあるまいか。住民諸君の現状を詳々に視て皆さんがその去就に迷つてゐることは充分に想像し得た。抑も日系人を沿岸地方から立退かしたものは生産と人力経済の黙から一大失策だと考へてゐる。然し統ては決行された後である。吾々は眞摯に打崩の道を考究せねばならぬ

太平洋沿岸沿岸帰還の可能は有ると思つてゐるが、假令、帰還出来るにしても戦前のやうに集居團的生活は望まみ得ないと思考する。寧ろこの際、大市場に近しい東部地方へ分散的再轉住をした方が皆さん自身の爲、將來性があると思考する。

私の住む費府附近は、北歐人の移民が多く、私の州では一度も排日立法が提出されたことがない。紐育(約九十哩)では開戦と同時に日系人経営のズキ

ヤキ屋は一時閉鎖してゐたが、費府では開けたことがないのを見ても對日系人感情が好いかが判る譯だ。

再轉住希望者で小金を蓄蓄してゐる人は住宅を購入すれば、住宅問題は解決するし、商業は何んでも出来、農業は小農式で、費府市場でいくらでも利かせられる。東部へ再轉住するにしても日系人は家庭働かしが出来ないやうに思はすことは一般米人に悪い印象を與へる結果になるから、技術のある人、商人、農家等が一家族位づつ再轉住したら戦後の保證を自ら得ることに

あるのでは無いやうか。
