### Some Residents May be Eligible for Old-Age and Survivor's Insurance Benefits

Some Heart Mountain residents, who have reached the age of 65, may be eligible for old-age and survivor's insurance benefits, it was announced by the social welfare department. Monthly benefits in amounts determined by the worker's average wage during the period one has been engaged in covered employment (type of employment covered by the Social Security Act) may be obtained by making applications through the Social Security office, Casper, Wyoming.

Individuals who reach the age of 65 and qualify for payment may write directly to the Casper office and give information (dates, employer, location) about the last covered employment. A representative from the Casper office comes periodically to visit the area and will assist with the completion of the formal application and filing of the claim.

If the claim is a proper one under the law, it will be approved and certified by the Social Security board for payment.

### Children Warned of Playing With Rocks Near Railroads

It has been brought to the attention of the internal security department that young children have been seen playing with and placing rocks on the railroad tracks, according to Rosie Matsui, police chief. Parents are warned to tell their children that there is extreme danger, both to the children and to the trains, in continuing this practice, and that if any accidents occur, there may be serious consequences.

If this practice is not discontinued, restrictive measures may be necessary, Matsui cautioned.

### Cannery Workers Will Leave Next Tuesday

The first group of workers signed-up for the Utah canning company and those going to the Kaysville cannery in Utah will leave 12 m. next Tuesday, according to the relocation office. Those departing are requested to contact Ed Nakano, junior leaves officer, to arrange for picking up their baggage, which will be limited to one suitcase and a bundle of bedding or duffel bag.

### Defendants Ask Clarification of Citizenship Status

That a number of the 63 Heart Mountain residents now on trial in the United States District Court in Cheyenne on draft evasion charges did not wish to report for induction until their citizenship status was clear was shown in proceedings of both government and defense Tuesday, according to word received here. United States District Attorney Carl Sackett introduced draft board files of eight defendants, and Defense Counsel Samuel Monip used them in cross-examination by reading letters addressed to the board by several of them, it was reported. One letter objected to "the interference of civil rights," while another stated that "I object to being taken into the army until my rights are restored to myself and my wife and baby."

Census Will be Taken on June 30

In accordance with WRA regulations, the statistics section will take the quarterly enumeration of the residents of Heart Mountain on June 30, George D. Diehl, statisti- cian, announced. The census is necessary to insure accuracy in the population records, which are used as the basis of justification for requests for material to operate the center, Diehl said.

He stated that, "It is realized that there is a certain amount of unavoidable annoyance in taking a census, but that we desire to keep this to a minimum. No re- strictions will be placed on the residents during the day of June 30, but if a per- son cannot be available on that date, he is requested to contact the statistics office later."

The same information that was needed in the last census will again be necessary. The enumerators will be the school teachers and assistant teachers of the public school system.

Police to Handle Lost and Found Articles Effective Today
