

Elementary School Regulations Announced

The following elementary school regulations were announced by school officials for the benefit of the residents:

The school laws of the State of Wyoming provide that a child may enter first grade if he is six years old before November 1 of the school year.

Heart Mountain maintains a kindergarten to prepare pupils for first grade. Any child who will be five years of age by November 1 may enter kindergarten in the fall. Children three and four years old may enroll in nursery school by making application at room 15 in the high school.

Those children who just arrived from Jerome and were enrolled in kindergarten there should enroll in the kindergarten here immediately since we are conducting a readiness program preparing the children for first grade. We will administer reading readiness tests to determine whether or not they are prepared to do first grade work.

Pupils from Heart Mountain who will be six by November 1, but who have not been attending kindergarten this year, should enroll immediately and we will try to get them ready for the first grade. If this group does not enroll in kindergarten they will be given a psychological test upon entering in the fall and if they are not mentally old enough to do first grade work it will be necessary to keep them in kindergarten all of next year.

Summer school work in the elementary schools is remedial and recreational. We can take care of those Jerome pupils in regular school work who, according to their report cards, did unsatisfactory work during the last school term.

For the rest of the Jerome pupils we will organize a recreational program if they desire to enroll.

Adult Education Classes Open to New Arrivals

Following are the classes offered by the adult education department as released by Walter C. Schlosser, vocational training supervisor, for the benefit of the newly-arrived residents from Denson: beginners, intermediate and advanced English, beginners and advanced shorthand, chemistry, electricity, sewing and dress designing, embroidery, crochet, artificial flower making and arrangement and fine arts.

Registration for the fourth-quarter classes, beginning July 10, can be made on July 3, 5 and 6 at the night school office in the high school.

Apprenticeship training in the following departments are also offered: retail sales, telephone operator, shoe cobbler, nurses' aide, dietician, laboratory technicians, motor pool work including a class in auto mechanics, electrician, plumber, commercial sewing, clerk-stenographer, bookkeeping-accounting, and agriculture.

Trainees receive the A rate of pay during the 8-week training course. Registration for this program can be made at any time in the night school office.
