

### WFA Will Provide Transportation to Centers for Inductees on Seasonal Farm Work

The War Foods administration has agreed to release and provide transportation to the center to evacuees on seasonal leave who have been called for induction if definite proof of the order is furnished, according to Dillon S. Myer, national WRA director.

Relocation officers will arrange termination of seasonal labor contracts on presentation of induction notice by the evacuee or a telegraphic notification from the project director, Myer said. However, he added that letters or wires from friends within the project will not be accepted as evidence that the person is to be inducted.

### Change in Procedure for Authorizing Moves Within the Center Announced

A change in the procedure for making new housing assignments and in authorizing moves within the center was announced by R. H. Embree, associate counselor of the welfare section.

According to the new instructions, persons now desiring to change their residence will fill out an application form on which will be indicated the new location desired and the reasons for requesting the move. The application will be considered by the welfare department and if circumstances justify, a move permit will be issued.

The permit will also serve as authority to occupy the new location to which the family has been assigned. No moves are to be made without the required permit, Embree said.

### Opportunity Offered for Girls to Enter Beauty School

Opportunity for four or five nice girls to enroll in the Waterloo beauty school at Waterloo, Iowa, was announced by Virginia Lynn, guidance supervisor. Tuition and books for the entire course will cost \$86. Length of the course will depend on the aptitude of the pupil with the minimum length of time for completion set at six months.

Although somewhat over-crowded, Waterloo offers a supply of part time jobs with room and board. Girls interested in enrolling at this school should make direct applications to Mrs. Julia Pitzemberger, 720 Lafayette, Waterloo, Iowa.

The relocation office at Des Moines will also answer any inquiries concerning this school and possibilities of jobs and housing at Waterloo.

### Pass Regulations Clarified

The recent tragedy which occurred emphasizes again the need for clarifying the arrangements which exist for leaving the center, it was announced by Melford O. Anderson, assistant project director. Residents leaving the immediate center area to go into but not beyond the outer project area boundary should have in his possession proper authority, represented by a red button, which may be secured at any of the exit gates. A clerk is stationed at each of the gates from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for the purpose of issuing these passes. To go beyond the project area boundary requires special types of leaves signed by the project director.

In the future persons found in or tampering with the irrigation laterals or the main irrigation canals adjacent to the center will be subject to disciplinary action. The Garland canal in which the tragedy occurred belongs to a private concern and anyone found in the canal, on the canal banks or tampering with canal structures will be subject to arrest by the county sheriff.

### Resident Killed by Unknown Assassin

George Yamasaki, 41, of 23-7-2, formerly of Santa Clara, Calif., was shot from ambush this morning near Cowley where he had gone as a day-laborer.
