Summer Elementary School Program for Second Six-week Period Announced

Remedial work in reading, language, spelling and arithmetic and a recreational program will be offered at the Washington and Lincoln elementary schools during the second six-week period of the summer school session, it was announced.

The remedial work to be offered 9 to 11:30 a.m. on week days is planned for students who have been notified that they need study in the various courses.

Changes Made in USO Regulations

Guest cards issued in the past expired as of July 1. Cards will be renewed for enlisted reserves at the community activities headquarters, 16-N, daily except Sunday, 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. No admittance will be made unless the proper card is shown to the receptionists at the USO.

Tuesday and Thursday evenings may be reserved by private parties, clubs and servicemen's families, to entertain servicemen, enlisted reserves and those who are awaiting induction.
