New Regulation for Animals Announced

A supplemental provision to the regulation concerning animals providing that "no pet shall be permitted to be kept if it becomes a public nuisance or against the sanitary rule," has been passed by the Heart Mountain community council and approved by Guy Robertson, project director.

The supplemental provision reads in full:

Section 13: Keeping of Pets. No pet shall be permitted to be kept if it becomes a public nuisance or against the sanitary rule which will be determined at the discretion of the sanitary department of this center.
