Form Letters Available for Asking Caucasian Aid in Returning to California

Form letters asking for the aid of Caucasian friends in restoring the rights of evacuees to return to California are now being prepared for distribution, according to Ichiro Hatchimori, councilman.

Letters will be available at the respective block managers' offices.

If enough Caucasians in California will write to Henry L. Stimson, secretary of war; John J. McCloy, assistant secretary of war; Maj. Gen. Charles M. Bonesteel in command of the Western Defense Area; and Dillon S. Myer, national director of the WRA, the war department may allow Japanese to return to the West coast, it was expressed by the Rev. Herbert V. Nicholson of Pasadena, Calif., a recent visitor here.

Residents are urged to send these letters to as many friends in California as possible.

Second Batch of Anniversary Issue to be Sold Friday

Hospital Faces Critical Shortage of Nurse's Aides

Nurse's aides are needed immediately to relieve the critical shortage in the local hospital caused by an increasing number of aids leaving on seasonal and indefinite leaves, according to Walter C. Schlosser, vocational training supervisor.

A new class in nurse's aide training began yesterday. Instructions continue for eight weeks. Class meetings are two hours daily while the remainder of the time is spent in practical application of the work in the hospital. The course, broken into 12 units, provides training for work in the hospital, experience for outside employment and valuable information relative to care of persons confined to the home. Residents are urged to register for the new class immediately at the night school office in the high school. The girls may work part or full time.
