

Army Ordnance Division Offers Excellent Jobs to Evacuees

One of the finest job offers ever made to evacuees is available to the residents of Heart Mountain through the U. S. Army Ordnance Division which has openings for several thousand family men to work in Army Ordnance depots located west of the Mississippi river and east of the Sierras.

Three members of the Army visited the center yesterday to explain employment opportunities, living conditions and community acceptance at a meeting attended by various community leaders. According to the Army representatives, the type of work offered at the present time will be in moving various types and calibers of ammunition. However, it was emphasized that the ammunition is not fused and there is no danger of explosion involved in the work. To local families, the jobs are offered at the Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah, near Salt Lake City.

The jobs will be under civil service and workers will be eligible to all privileges and benefits entitled to other government workers. Wages will conform with the average hourly rate paid to persons doing the same type of work in the territory surrounding the Ordnance Depot. The work week is composed of 40 hours, but men will usually work from 48 to 54 hours per week, with time-and-a-half over 40 hours. If qualified, workers will receive raises in pay according to their ability.

Complete housing facilities will be provided at the Ordnance Depot for the workers and their families. There are one, two or three bedroom apartments, which include living room, kitchen and bathroom. The apartments are furnished to meet the standards of the average American home. Silverware, kitchen utensils, blankets and sheets are provided for a flat charge of \$1 per month. Apartments may be rented from \$28 to \$39 per month depending on the size, and the cost includes everything but food and fuel.

It was also pointed out that in addition to housing at the depot, there are complete community facilities such as a community recreation hall and theater, where motion pictures are shown regularly; a large market where all staple groceries, green vegetables and meat are sold at established prices; a drug store and a beauty shop.

The housing area is also only three miles from the city of Tooele, to which there is regular hourly bus service.

Community acceptance and schooling opportunities are guaranteed. Army officials have met with community and church leaders so that the evacuees will be accepted by residents of communities to which they may visit.

It was stressed that only family men who are interested in moving their families to the depot and becoming an actual part of the wartime community will be considered. A representative of the Army is expected to be at the relocation office Monday to interview prospective workers.

Applicants must fill out the personal security questionnaires and the clearance, if extended, will be received in 15 to 20 days from the day of filing, it was announced.

The following comments concerning the job offers were made by a few of the community leaders who were present at the meeting yesterday:

Eiichi Sakayyo, chairman of the block managers--"It's a splendid opportunity for relocation and at the same time to do our part on the home front for the war effort."

Howard Otamira, block 14 manager--"A good chance for the Nisei to gain a foothold for post-war plans."

The Rev. Jutaro Yokoi--"Surprised and disappointed that the Nisei will be restricted; however, it is an excellent opportunity for the Nisei."

Overseas Christmas Packages Must be Mailed Between September 15 and October 15

Residents are reminded that Christmas cards and packages for members of the armed forces overseas must be mailed between September 15 and October 15. Packages mailed during this period marked as "Christmas Parcel" will not require a request from the addressee.

The war and navy departments have pointed out that members of the armed forces are amply provided with food and clothing and the public is urged not to include such items in Christmas packages.

The following restrictions and regulations pertaining to gifts must be strictly adhered to: (1) Packages may not exceed 5 pounds in weight or 15 inches in length, or 36 inches in length and girth combined. (2) Perishable matter will not be accepted and the sending of fragile articles are discouraged. (3) Not more than one package will be accepted for mailing in any one week for the same addressee. (4) Parcels may not be insured and letters containing money may not be registered. Gifts of money should be transmitted by money orders.
