Fourth Game of All-Stars Series to be Played Tonight

Having won two games out of the three played to date, the Heart Mountain all-stars will attempt to sew up the three-out-of-five game baseball series with the Gila all-stars in the fourth contest which is scheduled to start 5:30 p.m. today.

After dropping two straight, the visitors came back strong last night to win a 15-9 decision in a free-hitting ball game which was called after 8 innings on account of darkness. Both of the starting pitchers were knocked out of the box early in the game and Lefty George Fujioka of the Gila nine was credited with the victory after relieving Tak Abo in the third. John Santo started on the mound for the locals with Bill Shundo taking over in the fourth.

The Heart Mountain all-stars won the first game of the all-star series 5-4 Saturday afternoon on Mori Shimada's triple into deep center with two out and two on in the last of the ninth with the score 4-3 against them. George Iseri, who relieved starting hurler Toxie Watanabe in the ninth, was the winning pitcher, Abo was on the rubber for the losers.

Iseri won his second straight game on Sunday when he bested Fujioka in a close 3-2 mound duel to give the locals a two game edge in the series. After scoring one run each in the second frame, Heart Mountain took advantage of two errors and a single by Shimada in the sixth to send two runs across the plate for a 3-1 lead. Abo connected for a home run in the eighth to close the gap to 3-2 but the Gila's were unable to threaten thereafter.

Despite the outcome of tonight's game, the fifth game of the series will be played from 5:30 p.m. tomorrow.
