

Quarterly Census Will Be Taken on September 30

Center-wide census will be taken as usual at the close of the present quarter on Sept. 30, according to George D. Diehl, head statistician. As has been explained before, this is done to provide an accurate check of the records kept at the statistics office. These records are important in obtaining funds for operating and maintaining a proper accountability of WRA's responsibility.

Visitors and people on short term, seasonal and indefinite leaves are not counted. As before, enumerators will ask for the name, family number, center address, date of birth, marital status, citizenship, alien registration number and sex of each individual.

If any members of the family are to be absent during the census, they should obtain a sheet from the block manager, fill it out and leave it outside the apartment door, Diehl said.
