

### Thirteen Families Complete Applications for Ordnance Work

Thirteen families totalling 39 persons have completed applications for vital war work at the Tooele, Utah, ordnance depot, according to Joe Carroll, relocation program officer. Applications have been received from five to eight other families. The first contingent from Heart Mountain will leave as soon as the applicants are cleared by the provost marshal general's office. Issei who have nisei in their families were urged by Carroll to make applications along with nisei members of their families.

### Revised Dental Program Announced

Under the revised dental program at the center hospital, residents requiring dental care should obtain appointments from the receptionist at the dental clinic, Dr. Charles Irwin, chief medical officer, announced. It is the desire of the health staff to give essential service to a large number of residents instead of elective dental work to a few, Dr. Irwin stated.

Since the dentists are working in rotation, appointments will be made to chairs instead of doctors. In order to avoid confusion in the appointment schedule, patients are requested not to ask for a special dentist. A quota of 60 cases per day, including 12 emergencies, will be handled by the dental clinic.

Minor dental work for school children are being cared for by the dental clinic at the high school. If a student requires special service, he will be referred to the central clinic. The high school clinic will handle only dental work for school children.

Ask Cooperation of Unemployed Residents

The existing shortage of center employees has about reached the critical stage and unless better cooperation from the unemployed residents is not received in filling the more vitally needed positions, some departments will be forced to close until replacements can be made, according to the internal employment office. This may create inconvenience and hardships on the part of residents, but must be faced if the shortage continues. The return of seasonal workers is expected to relieve the situation slightly, but statistical figures show people are leaving on indefinite at the rate of about 50 a week, leaving the remaining employable in the center to a limited number.

The present urgently needed replacements include 12 hospital nurses' aides (issai women are encouraged to apply), 1 cook's helper (1-30), 4 cook's helpers (8-27), 1 cook's helper (15-27), 1 relief cook (22-30), 1 cook's helper (28-30), 1 cook's helper (30-27), 1 cook's helper (30-30), 1 nutrition aide (14-27), 1 assistant nutrition aide (28-30), 1 assistant nutrition aide (23-27), 2 cook's helpers (23-30), 1 nutrition aide (23-30), 1 nutrition aide (28-30), 1 waitress (personnel mess), 1 hospital cook, 1 hospital diet kitchen helper, 5 food swappers (warehouse).
