

Center Faced With Critical Coal Shortage

The center will be faced with a critical coal shortage unless residents are willing to cooperate in the present emergency, Lundgren T. Main, head of the supply division, announced in a statement issued today.

"We have reached a critical situation in the center with respect to deliveries of coal," he said. "Coal is now being delivered to the camp on the basis of what the present crew can unload. This crew now consists of 28 men who are able to unload on an average of 15 cars per week. This amount does not meet the current requirements for the camp and in order to get ample reserve on hand for the approaching winter, we should unload approximately 25 cars per week."

"In order to reach this goal, 20 men will have to be added to the present crew. The early fall coal problem coincides with seasonal demands for the harvest and is a situation that is of vital importance to all residents. The employment service cannot cope with this problem at present."

"Any help that the residents can furnish during this crisis, even temporarily, will be appreciated by the project director and his staff. One extra man from each block would solve this problem and provide ample coal for the entire area with enough for a reserve supply. Interested persons should contact the employment office immediately."
