Won't you lend your good will and cooperation and get your mind organized? Eliminate fears as they prevent important progress. There should no longer be this sort of doubt. Many of your friends on the outside are now enjoying a normal life. True, a few have not succeeded so far, but their day and their luck will come if they are consistent. If you come East, you enjoy security in many states, so can you move about if you choose. The WRA officers will do their part to help you, but you do need to meet us half way.

Some boys have left this week for New England, but there is the YOUNG GIRL problem. Being a woman herself, Miss Reynolds feels sorry for the many girls here who are not getting a chance. She believes the good mothers are so conscientious about daughters' welfare that they become uncompromising and fail to realize the injustice they are doing. These girls should be out NOW so later in life they will not blame the parents for lack of opportunity. They should learn something about housekeeping first so they can become good wives later on.

Little 16-year old Tomiko came to Boston one year ago and last June her classmates presented her with a purse of \$439. Then she was employed as a domestic for a Federal Court Judge where she enjoyed a pretty room and bath of her own. Recently the Judge promised her a \$500 bonus in addition to her weekly salary if she would stay on until the mid-year opening of her college. When Tomiko enters college she will not only be financially wealthy, but wealthy in having gained such friends. Tomiko's mother has no regrets! Other girls have saved their money and are now setting up homes for their parents to enjoy when they arrive. Others are educating their younger sister or brother, while others have saved for their own education.

Today a private group is offering a scholarship to HARVARD UNIVERSITY. Who is the Heart Mountain boy to receive this honor?

American Youth Hostel wants a nice 13-year old boy and will send him to a boys' school. A mother may accompany this boy and receive pay for light work. Children's Friend society needs a secretary. \$1400 to \$1600 per year depending on education.
