Messages will be accepted by the Red Cross until Nov. 30 from relatives and friends to United States prisoners of war and United States civilian internees in Philippines whose addresses are known for delivery after they are liberated. Minokichi-Tsunokai, local chairman, announced. Messages will not be accepted for free civilians or Filipinos and will be subject to army overseas mail censorship. Although the Red Cross cannot guarantee delivery of every message, all efforts will be made to reach addressees so that they may establish direct contact with their families as soon as the islands are liberated.
