

A Minute of Silence Planned for Men Killed in Action

By arrangement of the community council, a minute of silence for the Heart Mountain servicemen killed in action will be observed throughout the project at approximately 2:10 p.m. Saturday, Melford O. Anderson, assistant project director, announced. The signal will be sounded by the fire siren.

The complete program for the memorial services at 2 p.m. Saturday at the high school auditorium will appear in Saturday's Sentinel.

Coal Shipments May Be Curtailed

Unless some effective corrective measures are adopted throughout the area to consume the slack coal, it may be necessary to stop coal shipments until such time as coal now on hand is consumed, Lundgren T. Main, supply officer, announced. An inspection of the area indicates that only a few blocks are keeping their coal piles in good order, while many are permitting the coal to spread over a large area, and wasting all except the lumps, Main said.

It is reasonable to assume that if some blocks can care for their coal piles properly, that all should be able to do so. Main and the block managers are giving consideration to proposed plans to eliminate the bad practices being permitted at present. Any program, if it is to be successful, will require the support of all residents and it is hoped that some effective method other than the curtailment of coal shipments can be inaugurated, Main said.

Don't Address Express Shipments to Relocation Office

A recent message from one of the Eastern relocation officers asks resettlers not to address express shipments in care of the relocation office, according to Claud C. Gilmore, relocation officer. The relocation offices have no receiving or storage facilities and shipments may become lost. They suggest the resettler address the shipment to the city of destination with notation "Will Call".

While it is recognized that many persons departing for resettlement in distant cities have not established a permanent address to which their personal belongings may be sent, it is believed the most convenient way to handle shipments is to have them held by the carrier until called for. This will allow for temporary storage at a nominal cost until the owner is ready to call for his belongings.

Deadline for Filing "Declaration of Estimated Tax" Near

Residents whose income during 1944 will be sufficient to require filing a "Declaration of Estimated Tax" should file these declarations at once, according to Byron Ver Plogg, project attorney.

The law requires that single persons whose total income is \$500 and married persons whose total income is \$1200, must file an estimate if 100 or more of that income is from sources not subject to withholding tax. Some of the chief sources of such income would be rent, interest, dividends, wages for farm labor, and wages for domestic help.

Where the income received during the year is subject to withholding tax, no income tax estimate needs to be filed unless the income is \$2700 or more for single persons, or \$3600 or more for married persons.

Persons having doubt as to whether they should file a tax estimate or who need help in preparing them should consult the project attorney's office.
