Detailed policies for operation of the Tule Lake center have not yet been finally determined. The WRA will continue to administer the Tule Lake center. However, once the segregation program has finally been completed, the segregation center, wherever located, will be operated by the Department of Justice, the director's message concluded.

Affidavits May Be Filed by Depositors of Seattle Bank

Announcement of a decision of the alien property custodian to permit filing of affidavits to explain loss of passbooks or certificates of deposit in the Sumitomo bank of Seattle, will be helpful to evacuate depositors who wish to prove their claims, according to Project Attorney Byron Ver Ploeg.

Previously it was almost impossible for one who lost his passbook to prove a claim of deposit, because the claimant was required to produce his passbook or furnish a bond or certification of a Washington county clerk as to his assets, Ver Ploeg said.

Persons who have had any difficulty on claims against the Sumitomo bank of Seattle may receive help in the project attorney's office.
