

### Transportation Provided for Hospital Visitors

Beginning Friday, the motor pool will provide transportation to residents desiring to call on hospital patients during regular visiting hours. The service will be extended until April 1. At 1:45 p.m. daily, the truck will pick up passengers at the following stops: 6-27, 1-30, 6-30, 8-30, 12-27, 17-27, 20-27, 27-27, 28-30, 29-30, 25-30, 22-30 and 15-27. On the return trip, the truck will leave the hospital at 3 p.m. and the same route will be followed in reverse.

The night schedule will follow the same route and will begin at 6:45 p.m. Return trip passengers will leave the hospital at 8 p.m.

### Residents Warned Against Illegal Shooting

There is conclusive evidence that certain Heart Mountain residents have been guilty of trapping or shooting Hungarian partridges and pheasants out of season, according to information received from Judge W.S. Owens of Cody, by Rosie Matsui, chief of police. Destruction of these types of wild game constitutes a serious state offense and residents were warned that anyone found guilty would be subject to severe punishment.
