Director Urges Residents to Attend Mass Meet Tonight

In his first meeting with Heart Mountain residents, Director Dillon S. Myer this morning addressed members of the community council and block managers, urging them to establish new homes--either on the West coast or wherever they might have the best opportunity. WRA will continue its fight for evacuees but no victory can be won, Myer said, as long as residents remain in the center.

During the session, the director answered questions prepared before hand by members of both the council and managers. (Because of the time necessary for translation, the questions and answers will not be published until Saturday's Sentinel.)

The director expressed every confidence in the satisfactory relocation of every person in the center on a basis of comfort and security. Director Myer asked every center resident to attend tonight's mass meeting in the high school auditorium at 7:30 p.m.

Myer spent the afternoon meeting with different groups and visiting different sections of the project. At 3:30 p.m. he met with the appointed personnel in the high school.

Friday morning will be spent by the director conferring with heads of the relocation, welfare and reports divisions. Director Myer hopes to be able to confer with all persons having major issues to discuss before he leaves.
