動詞とは speak (話す), shine (輝く), have (持つ), などの如く、
事物の動作又は状態を述べる語でありますことは既に述べましたが
大別致しますと自動詞と他動詞との二種と云ります。

自動詞 (INTRANSITIVE VERB)

自動詞とは bloom (咲く), dance (踊る), go (行く) 等の如く、
動詞それ自身で意味の完全なるもので、世の事物や人には
何等の作用を及ぼさずいものであります。

The roses bloom. 薔薇が咲く。

The young people dance merrily in the recreation hall.

若者は娯楽館で楽しく踊る。

[上例中 bloom, dance は自動詞であります。即ち (薔薇が咲く)、
(若者は娯楽館で踊る) と云ひますとそれを食ひて完全なる意味を
表してゐます。Merrily や in the recreation hall 亦とは dance を修飾す
る副詞のと云ふ附屬物であります。]

他動詞 (TRANSITIVE VERB)

他動詞とは see (見る), bring (持つて来る), teach (教へる) 等の如
く、その働きが他の事物や人まで及ぶものであります。

He kicked a dog. 彼が犬を蹴った。

[上例中 kicked (蹴った) は他動詞で単に (蹴った) だけで何物蹴ったのか
判りません。その後には a dog と云ふ語が来りまして初めて意味が明
かとなります。而して a dog の如く他動詞の働きを受ける語を 目的
(OBJECT) と云ひます。そこで分り易く云ひますと、目的を達しず自動詞
は自動詞で、目的を達するものは他動詞と云ひます。尚ほ目的と云
ふ語は、主語の場合と同様に、普通は名詞と代名詞であります。]
