

Nurse's Aides Urgently Needed at Local Hospital

An urgent appeal for nurse's aides to alleviate the shortage of hospital personnel in the local hospital was issued by Margaret Wolford, chief nurse. A nurse's aides trainee course will consist of a two-hour daily classroom period and floor work in the hospital for the remainder of an eight-hour day. The course is eight weeks in length, subject to renewal for more advanced training.

All trainees will be paid on a WRA "A" rating while learning. Upon completion of the course the trainee may work at the hospital on a regular wage scale.

Many of the soldiers returning from the far flung battlefronts will require hospitalization, Miss Wolford said. Young girls who will become potential housewives as well as mothers, and wives of servicemen will profit by this training in caring for their loved ones when hostilities cease. Also this course will prove invaluable in good housekeeping in the knowledge gained, Miss Wolford added.
