Cozzens Asks for Correction of Statements Made in Colorado Times

In order that readers of the Colorado Times (Denver) may "know the truth of the west coast situation," R. B. Cozzens, assistant WRA director, asked in a letter for a correction of a recent statement made in the Times that Raymond Booth, field officer of the Los Angeles office, lectured in Los Angeles schools "using six policemen as guards."

"This report is entirely wrong in every instance. Los Angeles police nor any other kind of police have been needed as guards for any citizen," Cozzens stated.

"In fact," he wrote, "the Los Angeles police officials have cooperated in pointing out to various groups in the city that relocation is to be accepted." He added that there have been some incidents, but the vast majority who have returned have found kindly welcomes.

Office Workers Urgently Needed

Office workers, especially stenographers, are now much in demand, according to the internal employment office. The evacuee property, property control and community council offices are asking for stenographers while a mail and file clerk is wanted by the office service section.

The warehouse also has an opening for a male property clerk who can do some typing, while two bookkeeping-clerks are needed by community activities. Several assistant teachers, both male and female for the high school, and female for the elementary schools, are urgently needed. Interested persons should apply immediately at the internal employment office.

Other positions available are 2 group activity leaders (blocks 27 and 28, part-time), 2 Japanese typewriter operators, 3 translators, 3 office clerks, 1 bookkeeper, 4 female counseling aides, 1 typewriter repairman, 9 nurses aides, 6 police officers, 1 male sales clerk (block 20), 1 female sales clerk (block 8), and 2 laboratory assistants.
