

Silver Star Ceremony Will Be Held Tonight at Auditorium

A Silver Star presentation ceremony, honoring Opl. Yoshiharu Aoyama, posthumous winner of the outstanding award for gallantry in action, will take place 7:30 p.m. tonight at the high school auditorium. Mrs. Tom Aoyama, mother of the nisei here, will receive the award which will be presented by Colonel Canary of Fort Warren, Cheyenne, who is making a special trip by plane for the occasion.

The program will open with an invocation by Vernon Ross, representing the Christian church. The Boy Scout drum and bugle corps will play a few selections under the direction of Mas Morioka. Addresses will be made by Douglas M. Todd, of the appointed personnel; Shintaro Hara, chairman of the USO family club, and T. H. Abe, district chairman of the Boy Scouts.

Mrs. Aoyama will be escorted to the stage by K. Okagaki, president of the Family club, and Tom Kobayashi of the block managers.

Benediction by the Rev. Kankai Izuhara of the Buddhist church, a moment of silence to be observed by the audience, and "Taps" by Junzo Ohara will conclude the program.

The girl Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, Boy Scout color guard and the high school selected girls' choir will also participate in the ceremony.

Chicago WRA Officer Here to Interview Evacuees

Earl DeSmidt, relocation officer from the Chicago area, is very much interested in resettling farm families as well as individuals in and around the North Central area. DeSmidt stressed the excellent opportunities awaiting evacuees in the fruit growing areas of Michigan. Michigan is one of the largest fruit growing states in the Union. The growing area along Lake Michigan produces the finest quality peaches, plums, pears, grapes, apples, cherries and other fruits. The growing season is comparable to the Santa Clara valley region in California. The community acceptance is exceptionally fine with many issei and nisei families established in these communities, DeSmidt said.

He also pointed out that both issei and nisei vegetable growers are becoming well established in the rich vegetable growing areas of Wisconsin, Illinois, Iowa and eastern Nebraska. Wisconsin for example has no Oriental or Caucasian land laws barring issei from owning farm property as well as commercial property, DeSmidt added.

DeSmidt is personally acquainted with many of the growers in this center. Having been with the department of agriculture in California for many years DeSmidt wishes to renew his old acquaintances and to discuss agricultural possibilities in general with those who are interested. During his two-week stay, he can be reached at the relocation office.

Saw Mill Employment in Idaho is Offered to Evacuees

W. J. Dutoau representing the Hallack & Howard Company at Cascade, Idaho is visiting the center to interview evacuees interested in securing this type of employment.

The saw mill is located right in Cascade, a town of between 1000 and 1500 population and is about 60 miles from Boise, Idaho.

The company needs 15 or more men in different occupations. They will need at least 4 green lumber pilers at \$1 per hour, 5 chain lumber pullers at 85 cents per hour and 6 dry lumber handlers at 87½ cents per hour. The hours of work will be 9 hours per day for six days per week, a total of 54 hours per week with overtime for over 40 hours. The gross per week will be \$51.85, \$53.38 and \$61. They will operate for 8 to 9 months.

Housing is available for 35 men in a large building which has a laundry and also a restaurant. Beds, mattresses, lights and heat are furnished at 25 cents per day.

The restaurant is operated by the Japanese employees themselves with their own cook and the cost of board averages around \$10 per week. This is an ideal arrangement for single men, particularly issei bachelors.

Dutoau will spend as much time as necessary to recruit these men and will be available at the outside employment office at Block 15-12-AB.
