

Many Single People, Childless Couples Sign Up for Seabrook Farms

Claud C. Gilmore, acting relocation program officer, received a telephone call from Harry Munyon, personnel officer, Seabrook Farms, Bridgeton, N. J. last Saturday. Munyon stated the agricultural program at Seabrook is about three weeks ahead of schedule.

Munyon also informed Gilmore that the work on the new family housing project is now under way, and the living quarters will be finished by fall. They have available at the present time apartments similar to those now being used by residents of Heart Mountain. The apartments are not modern but have community wash rooms, laundries, and latrines. The apartments are furnished except for china and silverware.

Munyon says that a small amount of furniture might be taken along for use in the apartment if desired. Some storage space is also available for household goods until the modern apartments are completed in the fall. Due to the critical lack of housing for summer workers at Seabrook, however, it will be necessary that two childless couples share one of the barrack type apartments.

A substantial number of single people and childless couples have already signed up with the relocation division to depart for Seabrook on April 16. If a sufficient number is ready to go on that date, a special car will be provided so that no transfers will be necessary enroute. Those who are interested in traveling by this special car should contact the relocation division before April 16.

Cleveland Evacuees Assured of Resettlement Assistance

Resettlement assistance for evacuees in Cleveland has been assured by action of the Cuyahoga County commissioners, according to word received from Dorothy Barber, district relocation officer.

The original difficulty arose when the county commissioners questioned their right to advance poor relief funds for the special resettlement assistance program. The attorney for the commissioners stated, "This is rehabilitation and not relief. I question the use of poor funds for this purpose. However, if federal funds can be advanced, there is no question of the ability of county authorities to provide the necessary service."

The matter was worked out when the Ohio welfare bureau requested an advance of funds from the Regional Social Security Board for use by Ohio counties in the assistance program. This met the technicality and enabled the county commissioners to give the green light to the program. Several advance families whose applications for assistance in purchasing furniture had been approved, but had been held up pending this decision, will receive checks within a day or so, Mrs. Barber said.

Typists, Stenographers, Nurses' Aides Urgently Needed

According to the internal employment office, numerous typists and stenographers are urgently needed by various divisions, and the cooperation of qualified residents is requested. Unless the hospital secures more nurses' aides and kitchen workers, some of its services will have to be discontinued.

Blocks 24, 25, 29 and 30 need janitors and boilermen at once, while both the high and elementary schools are still short of assistant teachers.

The following jobs are also open: 1 reporter, 2 Japanese typewriter operators, 3 bookkeepers, 4 female counseling aides, 6 police officers, 1 cook's helper (30-30), 1 p.m. cook (28-27), 1 radio technician, 2 male and 6 female sales clerks (department store), and 1 female sales clerk (block 24 dry cleaning).

With the windy season now approaching, all parents are requested to see that their children do not tamper with the boilers, as a draft door being left open at the wrong time, with a high wind blowing, might heat the boiler to such a degree that extensive damage could be done.
