

Application for Farm Labor Employment in California Accepted

The matter of evacuees making application for farm labor employment in California has been discussed with the Agricultural Extension Service Farm Labor office, according to information received by Joe Carroll, relocation coordinator, from Charles F. Miller, relocation supervisor in San Francisco. The Extension Service has issued advice to all of the Farm Labor offices throughout California and to each of the farm advisers that orders will be accepted from evacuees for farm work. A supply of "Applicant Registration Form FL-4" has been received here. Residents interested should contact the relocation office.

The letter sent by the Extension Service to all of the Farm Labor offices reads:

"Farm Labor offices of the Agricultural Extension Service are financed by funds provided by Federal legislation and are established to offer placement services to all workers and employers alike. Therefore, no discrimination will be exercised against racial groups of workers or against groups of employers.

"The Federal Government has recently announced that certain Japanese-Americans are now free to return to California and other states from which they have formerly been excluded. It is expected that some Japanese-Americans will wish to return to California for agricultural work. The Extension Service will accept orders for this type of labor where it is desired and will give job information to such Japanese-Americans as may request it.

"The War Relocation Authority is already negotiating with certain California agricultural employers for the return of groups of Japanese-American workers. If these worker-groups are brought to California, the nearest local office of the WRA will notify the nearest Farm Labor office in order that the presence of the workers may be taken into consideration in planning the best utilization of the agricultural work force in the county. The WRA will endeavor to recruit and transport to California Japanese-American workers whose services may be requested by farmers."

Shortage of Typists, Stenographers and Clerks Continues

Stenographers, clerks and typists are still in urgent demand by various divisions, and unless workers are secured to fill these positions, some of the services will have to be discontinued, internal employment officials warned. The cooperation of qualified residents is requested to relieve this critical situation.

The community enterprises is planning to pay its patronage dividends to the residents before the center closes, but in order to do this five clerk-typists are needed immediately. In addition, several sales clerks, both male and female, are needed by its stores, especially the dry goods store. It will be to the benefit of all the residents if these positions are filled.

The following positions are also available: 2 club leaders, 4 group activity leaders, 1 hostel attendant, 1 ambulance driver, 1 assistant relocation interviewer, 9 nurses' aides, 5 diet aide-waitresses, 1 reporter, 2 Japanese typewriter operators, 2 assistant teachers, 1 radio technician, 1 boilerman (block 24), 1 janitor (block 30), 1 janitress (block 24), 4 female counseling aides, 6 police officers, 1 cook's helper (personnel), 1 PM cook (30-27), 1 cook's helper (30-27), 1 dish washer (temporary).

Workers Wanted in Utah and Colorado

The Utah-Idaho Sugar company, Garland, Utah, wants several men, according to Claud C. Gilmore, acting relocation program officer. Housing is available for three families close to the factory. Also two 3-room apartments are available for either single men or small families. Year around work. Minimum wage for labor, 69 cents per hour, time and one half over 40. Skilled workers will be paid more according to ability. There are also several share crop or lease deals in vicinity of Garland with good housing. Summary of Laws on Alien Land Ownership Received

A copy of Solicitor's Memorandum which summarizes the laws of the various states with respect to alien land ownership has been received by Byron Ver Ploeg, project attorney. Japanese aliens residing in the United States may acquire and dispose of real property without restrictions in 18 states, according to the memorandum. Four additional states are also void of restrictions if the alien actually resides in the said states, Ver Ploeg said. Residents interested in being advised on the law of any particular state may consult the project attorney's office.

General Information

The area representative of the War Food administration has been requested to send an agent cashier to Heart Mountain to pay in cash those workers claiming reimbursement for subsistence, according to information received by Project Attorney Byron Ver Ploeg from F. F. Oppenlander, acting chief of operations in Portland, Ore. A supply of claim forms to be filled out by each worker claiming subsistence has also been received, Ver Ploeg said. All questions must be answered clearly and completely, and the completed forms will be given to the agent cashier upon his arrival here. Evacuees who went out on WFA farm work and who need assistance of the project attorney were asked to bring with them the necessary papers, including contracts.

Unless residents refrain from sending "tsukemono" in baggages, local depot officials warned that all baggages will be opened here for inspection. Another complaint was received from the Omaha, Neb., depot, where "tsukemono" was found in a baggage sent there from Heart Mountain.
