

More Passengers Needed for May 16 Special Cars

A few more names are needed in order to insure the special cars for the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas on May 16, according to Claud Gilmore, acting relocation program officer.

All those interested in going to the west coast via this through movement and who have not already done so should see Gilmore in the relocation division before May 10.

An attempt is being made to arrange two Pullman cars for June 4 in addition to the coaches already scheduled. Those interested in purchasing, or who are eligible for such service and who are going to either Los Angeles, San Jose or San Francisco on that day should discuss the matter with Gilmore at their earliest convenience.

It is intended that this type of special railroad coach service be continued through the summer with movements occurring about twice monthly or oftener if the demand is encouraging. Another movement for June 18 is already being contemplated.

Relocation Officer Here from Great Lakes Area

Carl L. Spicer, relocation officer from the Great Lakes district (Cleveland), has been in Heart Mountain for the past week interviewing residents who are interested in relocation opportunities in Ohio, Michigan, western New York and western Pennsylvania. Spicer comes direct from Cleveland and has full information on employment, housing, education and business opportunities in cities like Cleveland, Cincinnati, Columbus, Dayton, Toledo, Pittsburgh, Buffalo and Detroit.

According to Spicer, employment opportunities in the cities and on the fruit, vegetable and nursery farms in the Middle West are more numerous than at any time in the past.

The relocation officer will be in Heart Mountain for the next two weeks and can be contacted at the relocation office.

WFA to Pay Wage Claims of Citizen Evacuees

According to word received by Byron Vbr Floeg, project attorney, the WFA has completed arrangements to pay wage claims of citizen evacuees and alien evacuees who were employed as cooks in the various WFA labor camps last summer.

All claims by citizen evacuees have been approved in Washington and checks are expected to go out within a few days. Instructions were issued recently to complete payment for first 60 days of service of all alien cooks employed.

WFA auditors are expected back from the different field offices by May 8, at which time final claims will be prepared for the remaining payments in excess of 60 days employment by alien evacuees.

Local Sugar Supply Cut by 25 Per Cent

Heart Mountain's sugar supply has been cut 25 per cent, the same as every other American community, Fred Haller, chief steward, told the community council Thursday. Effective May 1, on orders of the Office of Price Administration, center consumption will be limited to 1 1/2 pounds per person each month.

Shortage of Stenographers, Typists and Clerks Continues
