

Pullman, Tourist Cars Not Available for Special Movements

Experience gained in the special coach movement of May 16 has taught us that the coaches furnished by the railroad company are clean, roomy and comfortable according to Claud C. Gilmore, relocation program officer. There is considerable uncertainty regarding the possibility of obtaining special Pullman or tourist cars to move West because of army requirements. Since publication of the special bulletin on May 11 tabulating the extra cost of Pullman and tourist car accommodations, general interest has waned. As a result of these developments, it will not be possible to arrange for such special service, Gilmore said.

Those eligible for tourist car or Pullman accommodations at WRA expense will be required to use regular service, and the reservations will be made by the leaves office. Arrangements for authorized attendants will also be made by the leaves office. All other friends or family members who wish to travel on the same tourist or Pullman car will be required to pay the difference in the cost of that service and regular coach service, according to Gilmore. Reservations for these people and others who wish this better type of accommodation will be handled by the leaves officer if desirable.

San Francisco Firm Offers Employment to Evacuees

The Simmons company of San Francisco, large peacetime manufactureres of beds and mattresses, which recently agreed to open its plant for employment to Japanese Americans, desires many more workers, according to information received here from Fred W. Ross, district relocation officer.

A great deal of educational work has been done among the employees and with the union. The union leaders have been constructive and have extended a welcome to evacuees, Ross said. There are openings for both men and women making army squad tents on day, swing and graveyard shifts.

Relocation Taxi Only for Those Actually Leaving Center

The relocation taxi driver reports many people are asking him to transport them to the depot for the purpose of seeing their friends and relatives off, according to Claud C. Gilmore, relocation program officer. Everyone is asked again to not expect or ask for a ride to the depot for this purpose. The relocation taxi is kept very busy taking care of those who are actually leaving the center, and it is impossible for the driver to transport others, Gilmore said.

For those relocating, Gilmore issued the following advice: "Do not forget your hand luggage when leaving the apartment. Keep your gate slip in a handy place in your pocket or purse so that it will be ready to turn in to the gatekeeper when passing through the gate."

More Help Needed at Tooele Ordnance Depot

Assuring that hisel and their parents are always welcome at Tooele, Utah, Captain H. N. Kinsey informed Joe Carroll, relocation coordinator, that more help is needed at the ordnance depot despite the end of the war in Europe.

Captain Kinsey also announced a reestablishment of wages for ammunition handlers at the Tooele ordnance depot. In the future all workers will enter ammunition handling jobs at 80¢ per hour minimum instead of 77¢. They will advance to 84 or 85¢ after thirty days and then to 89¢ at the beginning of the payroll period 60 days from the date they entered upon duty. Overtime still continues and all of the workers who have met their initial expenses now indicate that they are able to save some money.

Where in the past it was felt that a man with three or four children would have a difficult time, it is the consensus of opinion that they will be able to live very comfortably under the new wage scale. The Tooele ordnance depot now pays the highest wages of any ordnance depot in the United States.
