

Evacuee Sick Leave Regulations Revised

Effective May 1, 1945, evacuee sick leave regulations have been revised as follows: full and part-time workers are entitled to 15 days sick leave a work year. A worker will be credited with sick leave at the rate of one day and two hours per month, and shall be available for use at any time during that or following months.

Workers assigned between the 1st and 15th of the month shall be credited with one and a quarter days. Workers assigned between the 16th and the last of the month shall be credited with one and a quarter days. Workers assigned between the 16th and the last of the month shall be credited with five hours for the calendar month. Advance sick leave shall not be granted but will only be granted as earned.

Additional Instructions for June 18 Departees Issued

Railroad tickets, ration books and grants must be obtained by those leaving on the June 18 special coaches on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, according to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation officer. The relocation division will help with these matters and will furnish transportation to the depot for tickets. Checkable baggage will be picked up Monday, the date of departure. Have it ready because the baggage trucks will start early. The family member holding the tickets must accompany his baggage to the depot for the purpose of checking it.

All baggage possible should be checked, retaining for hand luggage only items necessary for the trip. You can travel more comfortably with only a small amount of hand luggage, Gilmore said.

The running schedules of the June 18 special coaches, together with leaving and arrival times at various destinations, will be published in next Thursday's bulletin.
