Schools to Remain Closed

The following letter from Project Director Guy Robertson was received by George M. Kaki councilman, who is head of the committee on the problem of schools:

"It has been called to my attention that a meeting has been called to discuss ways and means for providing schools at Heart Mountain this fall."

"There will be no schools at Heart Mountain this fall and anyone suggesting that there might be is only creating a false hope and providing false leadership. The center will close on or before January 1, 1946 and all school children should be relocated to places where public schools are available for them before the fall term starts."

"Our Congressional appropriation provides less than \$10,000,000 for all center operations exclusive of Tule Lake. This meager budget will probably necessitate the closing of some or all centers before January 1, 1946."

"Let me suggest that people who really have the welfare of our school children at heart use their energies and best efforts to help them get located in communities where public schools are available and not encourage a false leadership that might deny the children the advantages of educational institutions."

"I am thankful that we do have the cooperation from most all the people of Heart Mountain in our efforts to see that the school children have opportunities to continue their studies without interruption in good schools and in more pleasant surroundings outside, and it is my hope that this small minority will not be able to confuse anyone."

Transcripts and records will not be sent to the students. Those wishing their transcripts sent should contact the student relocation office which will be moved tomorrow from the high school to the administration building.

Arrangements Made for July 6 Special Train Movement

The same arrangements for special coaches to move east and west are being made for July 6, as were used in the successful movement of July 18. It now appears there will be two coaches for northern California, two coaches for southern California, and two coaches for Chicago and points east.

Those wishing to reserve seats on these special coaches should register with Claud O. Gilmore in the relocation division by July 2. A considerable number have already signed up for this July 6 special.

Warning Issued by Guy Robertson

Children are warned against going to the river and main canal without proper gate passes. The following statement was issued by Project Director Guy Robertson, "It has been reported to me that children are going to the river and the main canal without proper gate passes. This is a violation that might result in a withdrawal of all center privileges including any resettlement grants. As this is of vital concern to parents it should have their immediate attention. We all remember that last year a boy was drowned in the irrigation canal out of bounds. If he had been with a supervised group the accident in all probability would not have happened. Parents should assist Internal Security officers to see that everyone leaving the center has a proper pass. Hikes for groups can be arranged by community activities who will provide supervision. Let us take precautionary measures to see that tragic or unfortunate incidents do not occur."

Supply of Ration Book No. Three will be Exhausted Soon

The local ration board has announced that ration book number three is not available and will not be issued to relocating evacuees after the present supply is exhausted. According to Lundgren T. Main, supply officer, all evacuees who are eligible for shoes at the time of departure, will be furnished a statement which will be good for book three at their local board where they have relocated.
