

Instructions for July 6 Special Train Issued

Those who wish to leave Heart Mountain for east and west on the special coaches July 6 should have all preliminary arrangements completed with the relocation division by July 2, according to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer.

According to present plans the train will leave the Heart Mountain depot at 7:30 p.m. This will give everyone an opportunity to have their evening meal in the mess halls, Gilmore said.

Taxis will be engaged on the two preceding days to assist people to get their railroad tickets. Ration books and subsistence grants should be picked up one or two days in advance. It will be necessary for the person signing for the transportation grant to sign for and receive the railroad tickets.

All checkable baggage will be picked up on Friday, July 6, the date of departure. The baggage trucks will start early in the morning and work through the day. Be sure and have all checkable baggage ready when the truck calls. The member of the family holding the railroad tickets will have to accompany the baggage truck to the depot to check the baggage. Everyone should check as much baggage as possible retaining for hand luggage only personal items necessary for the trip.

Besides persons for both northern and southern California and points east, this train will carry those wishing to go to Idaho and Utah. In all probability there will be a special car carrying Idaho and Utah people which will not go beyond Salt Lake City. Those interested should contact the relocation division at once.

Because of the popularity and success of these special coaches, one special train to leave Heart Mountain each week is being planned.
