

Final Instructions Issued for Tomorrow's Special Coaches

The railway company has agreed to bring the special passenger coaches which leaves tomorrow evening, some hours in advance in order that a crew may sweep and thoroughly clean them before loading, according to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer. In the past, some clean clothing have been soiled as a result of a considerable amount of cinders and smoke from the engine having entered the cars while being brought to Heart Mountain.

The train is scheduled to leave the Heart Mountain depot at 7:30 p.m. Taxis will start picking up the passengers at 6 p.m. Taxis drivers are authorized to pick up only those actually relocating. Others are requested not to ask the drivers to furnish them transportation, Gilmore said. The larger families will be picked up first in order that they may find suitable seats together as a group.

Passengers for Idaho and Utah will occupy the Los Angeles car. It was necessary to combine the two groups to fill the car. Since the Los Angeles group is rather small, it is entirely possible the railway company may not move this one car beyond Ogden or Salt Lake, Gilmore said. In such case, it will be necessary for the Los Angeles bound people to make one train change in either Ogden or Salt Lake. Relocation officers will be on hand at both places to assist the passengers if this change is necessitated.

Special Pullman Car Added to July 20 Movement

A pullman car to move west has been ordered for the July 20 special coach movement, according to Claud C. Gilmore of the relocation division. Those eligible for pullman accommodations at WRA expense, as well as, those interested in paying for an extra fare ticket to ride on this pullman are requested to fill out the necessary papers in the relocation division as soon as possible; Gilmore added. It will be necessary to ask those who are willing to pay for an extra fare ticket to deposit sufficient funds to guarantee the reservation, he said.

"We all realize the difficulty in obtaining pullman equipment at this time," he said. "We also realize the absolute necessity of pullman accommodations for some of our residents. Therefore, hospital and welfare officials, as well as, councilmen, block managers, and planning commission members are asked to cooperate to the fullest extent to see that this special pullman is sufficiently booked with passengers to insure its success," Gilmore added.

The system which will be used in booking reservations for this pullman will be, first come first served, Gilmore stated.

Housing for the relocation of families is also underway and plans should be completed in two months. Anyone working for James Yanari will be allotted a unit for his family if he so desires.
