Pullman Cars Virtually Assured for July 20 Movement

In a telephone conversation with railroad officials on Wednesday, Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer, was given considerable encouragement in the matter of obtaining tourist pullman cars for the special movement July 20. Although the railroad company will not give final confirmation on availability of sleeping cars until Monday. The opinion was expressed that chances of getting the cars were good. The coaches, of course, will move as scheduled, said Gilmore.

Two tourist pullmans have been asked for, one to move to Northern California and one to Southern California. While preference for pullman space is being given to those physically or otherwise unable to travel, there is still considerable space left which may be purchased by those wishing to buy an extra fare ticket. The deadline for reserving pullman space is Monday evening July 16. No further space will be alloted after that time and no cancellations will be accepted. Those who must pay for their own extra fare tickets must do so before that time, according to Gilmore.

Those who are eligible for pullman space at WRA expense will, of course, be alloted the necessary borths to be paid for by WRA. Those who are going on short term leave, and those who are going on terminal leave who are not eligible for pullman space at WRA expense may ride the pullman by paying for the extra fare ticket. The cost will be approximately as follows:

All concerned are urged to make a concentrated effort to see that the pullman cars are filled to capacity and that this very necessary service is successfully utilized, stated Gilmore.
