

Train Number 5 Will Leave 7:30 p.m. Tomorrow

Special train number 5 will leave Heart Mountain 7:30 p.m. tomorrow, according to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer. The train consists of four coaches and two pullman cars for destinations as follows: One pullman and two coaches to Los Angeles; one pullman and one coach to Oakland (passengers for points south of San Francisco will change cars at Oakland) and one coach to Chicago and eastern points. Passengers for Idaho and Utah will please board the cars bound for Los Angeles, Gilmore said.

Those leaving on this train should make doubly sure they have picked up ration books, grants, railroad tickets and gate slips from the relocation division. Gate slips will be collected when passing through the gate. Taxis will start picking up passengers at 6 p.m. or shortly thereafter. Families will be picked up first and individuals afterward. Boy Scouts will assist persons onto the train with their hand luggage. Personnel from the relocation division will be on hand to see that everyone is comfortably seated and to guide pullman passengers to their reservations.

The train will arrive in Billings at about 11 p.m. and will travel thereafter according to the following schedule:
