

Train Number 6 Will Leave August 3

The next special train will leave Heart Mountain for points east and west on August 3, according to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer. No pullman cars will be ordered for this movement and the train will consist entirely of coaches, Gilmore said. Special trains are scheduled for every second Friday, thereafter, and will be increased to one each week sometime during the month of September, he added.

The next pullman movement is contemplated for Friday, August 17. Those wishing to make reservations for the August 17 pullmans, must do so by August 7. Again, primary consideration for pullman space will be given to those who are eligible for this service at WRA expense. Consideration will also be given to those members of the family who must accompany WRA pullman cases, Gilmore emphasized.

First Complete All-Evacuee Train Leaves Rohwer July 26

The following teletype was received by Project Director Guy Robertson from Arnold Serwer of the Washington WRA office.

The first complete railroad train carrying evacuees back to California will leave the Rohwer center July 26 with 425 passengers. Secretary of the Interior Harold Ickes said the arrangement was in conformity with the Office of Defense Transportation regulations.

In addition to a diner and two baggage cars, the train will include seven day coaches and a tourist sleeper reserved for the use of the aged, and sick. The all evacuee train is scheduled to reach California about July 31. The 125 Rohwer families traveling on the train includes nearly 100 children under 15 years of age. A few families planning resettlement in the Mountain States will leave the train at Pueblo for Denver, Colo. and at Ogden and Salt Lake City, Utah. Others in the group will get off at Lodi, Sacramento, Stockton, Fresno and Los Angeles. Many former Rohwerites who disembark at the main California stops will go to their homes in nearby towns and rural communities. From Fresno onward, only two coaches, the sleeper and one baggage car will make the trip to Los Angeles.

According to Claud C. Gilmore, assistant relocation program officer, if a sufficient number sign up for the August 3 movement, such a train would be provided.

Parents are warned by Rosie Matsui, chief of police, not to let their children play near the train tracks because it is too risky. The train moves without warning sometimes and the policemen cannot keep an eye on everybody. He also stated that hereafter persons not leaving will not be allowed inside the trains.

Matsui also warned residents against turning in false alarms for it could be very costly. If the police department catches anyone turning in false alarms, that person will be heavily punished, said Matsui.
