

### Banking Facilities

Arrangements are being made with the Shoshone National Bank to establish a branch office here. Details of its opening will be announced later.

### Housing Adjustments

Necessary housing adjustments will be made as soon as possible. A certain amount of crowding will be necessary due to an anticipated increase in population over the 10,000 for which the Heart Mountain Camp was designed.

### New Arrivals

The first contingent of approximately 1100 Colonists from the North Portland (Oregon) Center, the majority of them formerly residents of Yakima Valley in Washington, are expected Sunday.

After this group an undetermined number of colonists are scheduled to arrive from the Santa Anita Center.

### Visits By Nisei Soldiers

Nisei serving in the U.S. Army will be permitted to visit parents and relatives here on furloughs after induction and housing arrangements are completed. Details will be announced later.

### Barber Shops, Stores, Post Office

Barber shops and additional stores and field post offices will be opened as soon as space is made available for them.

Two stores are now in operation, one at Block 2, Building 25, the other at Block 8, Building 26. Store hours are 8:30 to 11:45 a.m. and 12:45 to 5:30 p.m. daily.

One post office sub-station is located at Block 6, Building 26. Temporarily all mail is distributed through this office. After the establishment of other sub-stations early next week sub-station 1 will serve blocks 1, 2, 6 and 8.

Sub-station 2, at B-12-26, serves blocks 9, 12, 17, 20.

Sub-station 3 at B-21-26 will serve blocks 21, 27, 28, 29.

Sub-station 4 at B-15-26 serves blocks 14, 15, 22, 25.

The main post office in the administration area will serve blocks 23, 24, 30 and the hospital.

### Banking of Houses

Before cold weather a protective bank of dirt will have to be built around the outside of barracks where the walls meet the ground. Colonists are urged to keep this in mind when preparing gardens or other improvements.

## Fire Regulations

Study fire regulations posted about the camp. They must be followed strictly in order to avoid the danger of fire.

In case of fire go to the nearest telephone and notify the fire department. Telephones are located as follows:

Intersections of blocks: 1-2-5-6; 26-27-28;  
8-9-12-13; 24-25-29-30;  
16-17-20-21; 15-22-23.

One fire barrel and two buckets are provided for every three barracks. It is imperative that the buckets be kept at the barrel at all times. It is prohibited to use these fire buckets for other purposes. Remember the safety of your home and your neighbors' home may depend on those fire buckets.

Rubbish is to be emptied in cans placed at the end of barracks. Pick-up service for these cans may not be as efficient as it could be for the first few days. If the can is full do not dump rubbish beside the can. Provide some kind of an additional receptacle.

## Releases and Transfers

Persons desiring to be released from Heart Mountain for private re-location may submit written applications with full details to the camp director, Mr. C. E. Rachford. This application must include in detail reasons for desiring to leave the camp, proof of assurance that the individual will be acceptable in the community to which he desires to move, and proof of ability to support himself.

Persons desiring to be transferred to other WRA camps, or to have others transferred to this camp are requested to wait until the induction period is ended and Heart Mountain is better settled. Further information will be made available.

## Schools

Under the present schedule grade and high schools will open September 8 in temporary classrooms.

## General Regulations

Colonists must stay within the boundaries of the occupied area until further notice.

Do not speak to the military police guard except in case of necessity or on official business.

Only members of the induction crew are permitted in the warehouse area at the time trains arrive.

## Information Office

The field information office now located at B-6-25 will be moved early next week to B-21-26.
