

Students to Register Monday, Tuesday

Elementary and high school registration for all students in grades from 1 through 12 will be held in various designated recreation halls on Monday and Tuesday, September 8 and 9, according to Clifford D. Carter, superintendent of schools.

A 6-6 system of education complying with the standards of the State of Wyoming Education Department and the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges will be followed.

The first 6 grades will comprise the elementary department and 7th through 12th grades will make up the junior high-high school division. This will enable students to transfer credits earned in the Heart Mountain High School and grade schools to other schools and also to obtain college entrance into all institutions of higher learning approved by the North Central Association.

According to the census survey of immediate students, there are approximately 600 in the lower 6 grades which comprise the elementary department, and 900 in the upper 6 grades from 7th through 12th.

The Wyoming law requiring attendance at school will be enforced.

Sixty-two Caucasian class room teachers and 8 administration supervisors have been hired. The balance of the teaching staff will be composed of colonists who meet the requirements of the Wyoming educational system of certification.

New text books and other school supplies are expected to be here in time for the formal opening of schools.

Plans are underway to open night school for adult education on October 5. A description of courses offered will be announced later. Plans for the formation of kindergarten will also be announced at a later date.

Registration for high school grades from 7th through 12th will be held in recreation halls in blocks 22, 23, and 25. Registration for elementary children from 1st through 6th grades will be held at the following recreation halls:

Blocks 1,2,6,8,	at Block 6 - 25
Blocks 9,12,17,20,	at Block 17 - 26
Blocks 14,15,21,22,	at Block 15 - 25
Blocks 25,27,28,29,	at Block 28 - 25
Blocks 23,24,30,	at Block 30 - 25

### Pomona Workers to Get Pay Checks

Pay checks for work performed at Pomona Assembly Center for the fiscal period July 8 to August 7 will be issued at the Information Office, Block 21-25, Tuesday, Sept. 8, from 1-8 p.m., John Nelson, administrative officer, announced yesterday.

Arrangements have been made for the First National Bank of Powell to cash the checks at the same building Wednesday, September 9, 3:30-8 p.m. A service fee not to exceed five cents per check will be collected.

Work orders issued at Pomona or other means of identification must be presented in order to receive the checks.

Those with P and S ratings are to report at window #1 and those with U rating at window #2.

### Taking of Scrap Lumber Prohibited

No lumber of any kind is to be taken until notice and permission of C. E. Rachford, project director, is officially announced. Scrap lumber will be made available to the residents after Heart Mountain is fully occupied and after the celotex lining of all barracks and other installations have been completed.

As Heart Mountain is a new relocation project and far from complete, a certain amount of inconveniences and confusion is bound to arise. However, if all colonists will exercise patience in regard to housing and other problems, adjustments will be made as quickly as possible.

### Housing Information

Celotex lining of walls and ceilings of all apartments will be completed when supplies and sufficient labor are available. Work has been started in Block 1.

Brooms and buckets will be issued immediately upon arrival of new shipment.

Residents are requested to refrain from using stoves until inspection and adjustments have been completed.

Hot plates and other electrical appliances impounded in assembly centers and shipped here will not be released at present because of overloaded power lines.

### Hospital Information

Out-Patient department will open in Ward 15 of main hospital in administration area beginning today.

Visiting hours at hospital are 2-3 p.m. daily.

Diphtheria inoculations for children will be continued when necessary equipment is available. Details of procedure will be announced later.

Dental clinic is located in Block 1 - 26. Do not come to main hospital for dental attention.
