April 1st was the official day for opening of pool, and the following regulations are to be observed.

Climbing over the fence is to be prohibited. The deep part of the pool is to be utilized only by those persons who are able to swim. Non-swimmers and small children will remain in the shallow part of the pool. Children under 6 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or person acting in behalf of the parents.

The following schedule hours to be observed:

9 am to 3 pm general admission, both adults and children. 3pm. to 5 pm. school children 6 years of age and over. 5 pm. to 7 pm. children 16 years and over. 5 pm to 7 pm. children 16 years and over and adults. Each individual enjoying the privileges of the swimming pool is cautioned to observe all of the rules of safety with respect to its use, it being hereby pointed out that each internee entering the pool does so at his or her own risk.

Safety in, and proper use of the swimming pool will maintained by one Japanese Senior Attendant and 8 Japanese Attendants. While one German Senior Attendant and three German Attendant will be at hand. These persons are charged with enforcing all regulations and safety rules and measures, and have the authority to limit any persons to particular section of the pool, or expel persons from the pool for violations.

Each person must take shower in bath houses before entering pool. The disinfectant footbaths must be used by all person upon entering and departing the pool. Other general rules of sanitation, such as expectorating in and around the pool must also be observed.

KELLY VISITS CRYSTAL CITY

Mr. Willard F. Kelly, Assistant Commissioner of the Immigration & Naturalization Service, made a week's visit to the Crystal City Internment Camp from April 1 to 7.

During his stay, petitions made to him by the Japanese Council were discussed. The highlights of the petitions are:

Increase of Maternity Cottages: An addition of at least 21 more Maternity Cottages, as there are only seven Maternity Cottages against the 2500 Japanese population, being entirely out of proportion with the German group which has always had 36.

Latrines, Laundry: One more laundry plant for the EQ area, and one more latrine and shower room in the D section.

Recreation: One Victory Hut in each of the 24 blocks to be used for recreational purposes.

Swings, slides, seesaws, chinning bars, etc., for the smaller children in each block. These could be constructed by the Japanese carpenters if and when the materials are furnished.

SPAIN WITHDRAWS AS GO-BETWEEN

The Spanish Embassy has formally withdrawn as the protecting power for the Japanese interests, according to the information received from the State Department.

KING OF KINGS

"King of Kings," a film depicting the life of Christ, will be shown tonight at Harrison Hall from 7 to 9 p.m.

This picture will be under the sponsorship of the Christian Church.

Clothing Allowance: The restoration of the former rates. The revised rates, effective April 1, 1945, are: \$1 for six mo. to 1 yr.; \$2 for two yrs. to 5 yrs.; \$3 for six yrs. to 13 yrs.; and \$4 for 14 yrs. and over. The former regulations on clothing allowance were \$1.75, \$3, \$4, and \$5.25 respectively.

Public Sanitation: Because the truck used to haul garbage and trash in the morning is used to deliver ice in the afternoon, a truck to be used exclusively for the garbage service and one for the ice delivery was requested.

Housing Conditions: To better the housing facilities of the Victory Huts in which 548 internees and their families are living. It would include the installment of kitchen sink, drain, running water and electric plugs for ironing. Roofing paper to prevent the present heavy leakage, extra shelter outside for cooking, or if not, a flue for the cooking stove.

Increase of Monthly Allowance for Children: Up to now, children have been receiving 25¢, 50¢ and \$1.50 allowances, but in order to provide them with a reasonable amount of drinks, candies, besides

TAIYO BOW TO ORANGE 9-3

With 3rd baseman Dr. Kimura slamming out a homer and three singles, the Orange finally did what other team in the circuit had been gunning for as they outplayed and outscored the Taiyo team to hand the champions of the first round their first defeat of 1945 old men's softball league 9-3 before a huge crowd.

In the 5th inning saw Orange scoring four more runs when Muta connected one for a circuit clout over center fielders head with bases loaded, the longest hit of the evening. In the 6th inning Orange scored 2 more runs on Hamaguchi's double to cinch the game and the championship for Orange Mura.

Also, the income from the government pay-jobs is not sufficient to remedy the situation of the children's needs. In fact, the Japanese internees in this camp has spent \$19,743.92 or more for materials alone in the construction of sun-shades and porches in the last six months.

PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT
PASSES AWAY THURSDAY

President Franklin Delano Roosevelt passed away Thursday, April 12, of a cerebral hemorrhage at his villa in Warm Springs, Ga.

Because of his recent poor health, the President had been convalescing at the villa since March 30. On that fatal afternoon, Mr. Roosevelt was posing for his portrait, when sud-

denly he put both hands against his head and said, "I've got a terrific headache." Those were his last words. He immediately fainted and did not regain consciousness again. Vice-Admiral McIntyre, the President's personal physician, was away in Washington, but Commander Bruemm, Navy Physician was in attendance.

Death came to the President at 3:35 p.m., two hour and 35 minutes after his elapse. Mr. Roosevelt was planning to stay one more week at Warm Springs, and leave for the White House, and attend then the coming San Francisco Conference.

Mrs. Roosevelt, who was in Washington at the time of his death, notified her four sons in the armed forces by telegram of the fact, and flew by plane to Warm Springs.

The official announcement of his death was made to the shocked world at 5 p.m., Central War Time. (cont. on pg. 2)

Immediately upon hearing the death of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Mr. Gongoro Nakamura, Mr. Sotaro Kawabe, and Mr. Shichitaro Fujii went to the officer in charge of this camp to express deep condolence, representing the Japanese group of the Crystal City Internment Camp.

The Japanese Council also passed a resolution to stop all ordinary music and singing, baseball, basketball, and all other games on the day of the funeral and burial, Saturday and Sunday, April 14 and 15, and also to postpone tonight's movie to Monday evening in memory of the late president.

JICHI-KAI GIVES
PETITION RESULTS

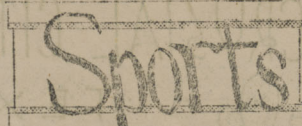

President Passed Away

 Mr. Roosevelt was 63 years old, and was the seventh president to die in office. Vice-President Harry S. Truman took oath of office as the 32nd president of the United States at 7:09 p.m. that same day. He stated that there will be no change in the present policy, nor in the cabinet nor the army and navy staffs. President Truman is 60 years old.

The official funeral service is scheduled to be held in the East Room of the White House today at 4 p.m. The President's body left Warm Springs by special train yesterday morning. Mr. Roosevelt will be buried in the ancestral cemetery at Hyde Park.

Of his sons, James and Elliot Roosevelt will be present at the funeral. Anthony Eden is flying across the Atlantic to attend the funeral, and Crown Princess Elizabeth may also come.

Franklin Delano Roosevelt was born in 1882, and is the distant cousin of Theodore Roosevelt. He obtained his A.B. in Harvard in 1904, studied law at Columbia from 1904-07. He practiced law for some time, and first started up his political ladder by becoming a member of the New York State Senate from 1910-13. He next became the Assistant Secretary of the Navy from 1913-20, then governor of New York from 1929-33. He entered the office of the President of the United States amid the economic chaos of the depression, and put new confidences in the hearts of the people with his historic words of "...We have nothing to fear but fear itself." President Roosevelt was the first president to be re-elected for a Third Term. He initiated administrative and legislative reforms known collectively as the New Deal.

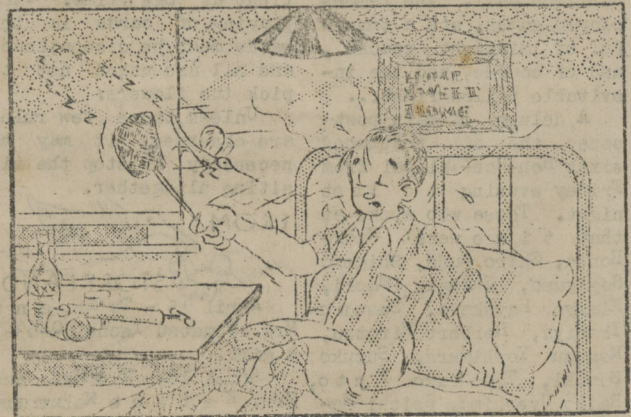

Young Men's softball players and managers meeting was held last Monday, as rules and regulations for the coming season was formulated.

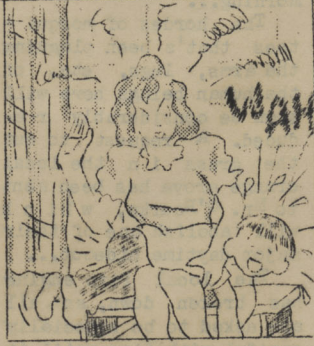
First problems faced was the classification of various teams into different leagues. With more additional teams entering this season, the league will be divided into four classifications, the ayes bees, cees, and the junior groups.

CRYSTAL CITY VISITED BY SWISS REPRESENTATIVE

Dr. Fischer, Swiss Legation representative, and Mr. Bailey of the State Department visited this community last week on a regular visit specified under the Geneva Convention.

The Swiss will act as the protective power for Japanese interests in the U.S. until diplomatic relations are resumed between Japan and the U.S.

Some of the matters discussed during their stay are:

Repatriation- The when and the where the repatriation will take place is not known. There will be no "exchange" in the real sense of the word, at steamships carrying American soldiers from the Pacific to the U.S. will not take the repatriates to Japan in turn. As the

whole matter of repatriation is still indefinite, a any discussion on this matter would be premature, and Dr. Fischer stated further writing on this subject to the Swiss Legation would be of no use.

Internees apprehended outside of the U.S. and those designated undesirable by the U.S. would most likely be sent back to Japan. Guess was made that the only people who will be forced to go are people who are very undesirable rather than slightly so from the U.S. point of view. Therefore, persons who merely have been member of Japanese Naval Society may stay in this country if they wish.

Persons who wish to go at their own expense will not only need the permission from the Department of Justice, but from General MacArthur or his deputies, stated Mr. Bailey.

Pushing the matter of repatriation was not encouraged, as a war fever

dies down, things may become more liberal, so a repatriate may take more things with him. Also, more shipping space would become available. However, nothing definite can be said, as policies may change momentarily.

Release- People released from this camp will receive transportation, and get help in finding housing and jobs before they leave here. Any further aids will have to come from the local relief agencies in the area in which they resettle.

There will be no more transfer of family members to this camp.

Nisei Citizenship- The mere act of going to Japan with their parents will not deprive the niseis of the U.S. citizenship. It is deemed that their citizenship will not be taken away unless they do something further, such as taking an oath of allegiance to the Japanese government.

Property- Persons going to Japan may not exceed the limit set for money. However, their property in the U.S. will not be lost, as they may have someone else manage it by giving them the power of attorney.

Hawaii Returnees- It is not known when internees may return to Hawaii, as the matter of transportation is still a problem.

Cancellation of Application for Repatriation- By filling out the proper forms, any individual may cancel his application for repatriation at any time.

Mails- Censorship of outgoing and incoming mails will not cease as long as the camp is in operation. Foreign-bound letters will continue to be written on the blue sheets.

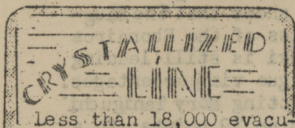

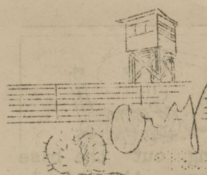

ON NESEI IN WARTIME JAPAN

Any nisei who spent the war in Japan is going to have a tough time if he ever wants to return to the United States, according to the ROCKY SHIMPO. The American State Department has not established any kind of a passport office in Japan, but it has been considered as a future problem.

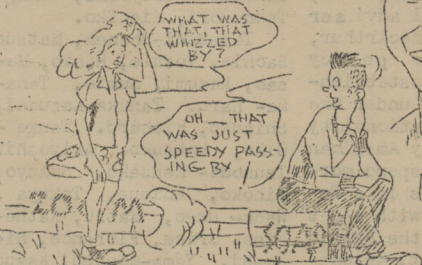

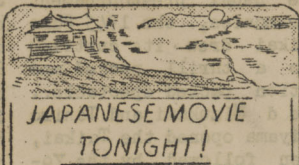
FREE TO LEAVE

Thousands who could leave, officials said, have been held back by threats voiced against Japanese on the Pacific Coast, and inertia born of three and a half years confinement behind barbed wire.

Terminal departures in Tule Lake may reach a figure for October equal to or greater than that for all of the first nine months of the year, as resettlers besiege the relocation offices, according to the NEWELL STAR.

During the 10 days the relocation offices have been opened this month, 466 persons have been scheduled to relocate in the various parts of the United States..

NISEIS IN ARMY

Nearly 21,000 niseis were inducted into the Army and the WACs between Nov. 1, 1940 and May 31, 1945, according to WRA Assistant Director R. B. Cozzens. Of this number, 20,861 niseis were taken into the army, and 79 into the WACs.

In that time, 162 niseis were commissioned as officers.

Up to July 31, 2,078 Japanese-Americans were trained in language schools and sent overseas. As of that date, 717 were scheduled to be sent overseas in August and 1,156 were in training for further assignment; with an additional 1,250 being procured for such training.

El Genio de Samuel Morse

Cuando los Estados Unidos le declararon la guerra a Inglaterra en 1812, el Congreso Norteamericano ignoraba que dos días antes el Parlamento Ingles había tomado acuerdos de índole conciliadora, que hubieran podido muy bien haber evitado el conflicto. Esa trágica circunstancia causó profunda impresión en el ánimo de un joven pintor norteamericano de veintidós años que acababa de llegar a Londres. En carta a su familia deploró vivamente, la imposibilidad de enviar noticias "en un instante" a través del Atlántico. Si glos hacía que los hombres aceriaban el sueño de mandar noticias con velocidad igual a la del propio pensamiento. Samuel Finley Breese Morse, le estaba reservada la gloria de hacer cristalizar ese sueño.

La fama que le dieron a Morse sus sensacionales inventos de otro orden han eclipsado casi por completo sus altos méritos como artista. Morse veía en la pintura su verdadera vocación, y no le faltaba fundamento para ello. A los veintidós años de edad conquistó renombre internacional con un cuadro que obtuvo uno de los nueve primeros premios entre los 2000 que se exhibieron en la Real Academia de Londres. Fue uno de los fundadores de la Academia Nacional de Dibujo de los Estados Unidos, la cual presidió por cerca de veinte años. En el de 1932, sesenta años después de su muerte, el Museo Metropolitano de New York honró su memoria con

Y añadió que pasaba el tiempo que le dejaban libre los estudios pintando miniaturas de sus amigos en marfil, a cinco dólares cada una. El estudio de la electricidad era su afición predilecta. 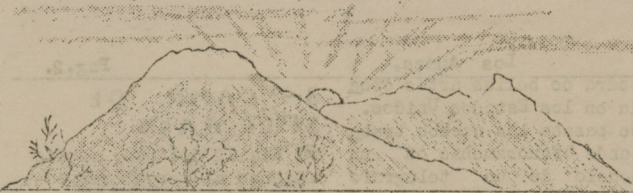

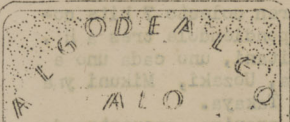
